REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

BOARD OF RECREATION AND PARK COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES

Thursday, April 1, 2021

The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners of the City of Los Angeles convened the telephonic Regular Meeting at 9:30 a.m. Present were President Sylvia Patsaouras, Vice-President Lynn Alvarez, Commissioners Tafarai Bayne, Nicole Chase, and Joseph Halper. Also present were Matthew Rudnick, Acting Assistant General Manager, Special Operations Branch, Assistant City Attorney Mike Dundas and Deputy City Attorney III Steven Hong.

CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

President Patsaouras called for a motion to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of March 18, 2021. Commissioner Halper made such motion and it was seconded by Commissioner Chase. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 5-0.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

Public comments on matters within the Board's jurisdiction were invited, 6 such requests were submitted.

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Matthew Rudnick, Acting Assistant General Manager, Special Operations Branch, provided the General Manager's Report and began by updating the Board on how RAP continues to support the City and County's vaccination sites by providing logistical support at RAP facilities. He also shared that The Los Angeles Homeless Services Authority (LAHSA) will continue to operate extended winter shelters for unhoused individuals at several RAP facilities and that Alternative Learning Program has started to wind down as LAUSD transitions into a hybrid in class learning. Mr. Rudnick also announced that as the County moves into the "Orange Tier" of the State's blueprint for reopening, more amenities will be available as more activities are allowed on RAP facilities. He then stated that City Council recently approved the re-establishment of the Managed Hiring Committee, which will allow RAP and other City Departments the ability to hire staff to meet operational needs and replace some of the City employees that have taken advantage of SIP. Mr. Rudnick reported that Echo Park is undergoing renovations and more updates will be provided as the maintenance repair and improvements project unfolds. Mr. Rudnick then invited Javier Solis, Superintendent of Maintenance, to address the Board regarding many of the RAP employees that will be retiring in April. Mr. Solis thanked and recognized these employees, many of whom are in the Gardener Caretaker job classification.

Mr. Rudnick concluded the General Manager's Report by announcing that the Update on Park Wide Camera System, originally scheduled to be heard today, would be presented at the April 15th Board Meeting.
