# RECOMMENDATIONS

- Approve the Participant Agreement, attached to this Report as Attachment 1, and 1. authorize the Department of Recreation and Parks' (RAP) General Manager or designee to execute such agreement and accept funds, if awarded, in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000), from NRPA, for participating in the Musco/NRPA Youth Sports Equity Learning Community (Learning Community), subject to Mayor and City Council approval;
- Direct RAP staff to transmit a copy of the documents to the Mayor, Office of the City 2. # <u>SUMMARY</u>

As a recipient of the NRPA 2021-22 Youth Sports and Play grant, RAP was invited by NRPA on January 10, 2023 to participate in the Musco/NRPA Youth Sports Equity Learning Community (Learning Community) in 2023. This Learning Community is focused on sharing successes, challenges, and trends related to youth sports. It will prioritize peer learning and networking with opportunities for structured education, and will include other previous and current NRPA Youth Sports grant recipients from across the county.

For participating in the Learning Community, NRPA will provide RAP with a stipend to support the Department's youth sports equity priorities. Participation in the Learning Community will provide RAP staff new insight to youth sports equity trends and challenges with peers from other cities across the country. Through this Report, RAP staff requests authorization to execute the Learning Community Participant Agreement, attached to this Report as Attachment 1, and to accept the participant funds stipend, if awarded, in the amount of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000) from NRPA.

### FISCAL IMPACT

Acceptance of the Learning Community Participant Agreement does not require RAP to provide matching funds, and therefore would have no impact to RAP's General Fund. The participant funds stipend for participating in the Learning Community will assist with RAP's youth sports equity goals.
