RECOMMENDATIONS

BOARD REPORT

- Approve the submission by the Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) of a Continued Funding Application (CFA) to the California Department of Education (CDE) for subsidized preschool services at RAP's licensed preschools through the California State Preschool Program (CSPP) for Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-25;
- 2. Authorize RAP's General Manager or designee to execute and submit the CFA in the form substantially as attached to this Report as Attachment 1;
- 3. Adopt the Resolution, attached to this Report as Attachment 2, as required for the submission of the CFA;
- 4. Direct RAP staff to transmit a copy of the aforementioned CFA documents to the Mayor, Office of the City Administrative Officer (CAO), Office of the Chief Legislative Analyst (CLA), and to the City Clerk for Committee and City Council approval before accepting and receiving any grant awards, pursuant to Los Angeles Administrative Code Section 14.6 et seg. as may be amended; and,
- 5. Authorize RAP's Chief Accounting Employee, or designee, to make any technical changes, as may be necessary to effectuate the intent of this Report.

SUMMARY

RAP has been receiving funding from CDE for over 37 years to provide licensed preschool services at Jim Gilliam Child Care Center, which has a capacity to serve 45 children in a high-need area, and for the last eight years at Ralph M. Parsons Preschool, which has a capacity to serve up to 90 children. Since 2022-23, RAP has received licensing for four additional preschools: Branford Child Care Center, Victory Valley Child Care Center, Hubert Humphrey Child Care Center, and Evergreen Child Care Center. RAP is still in the process of obtaining licensing for another six preschools: Van Ness Child Care Center, South Park Child Care Center, Ira C. Massey Child Care Center, Echo Park Child Care Center, Downey Child Care Center, and Banning Child Care Center. CSPP provides funding for subsidized care for pre-kindergarteners. This grant assists with serving children of families with incomes at or below seventy-five percent (75%) of the State median income level.

Studies have shown that preschool programming helps children develop academic, cognitive, and behavioral skills that have proven to increase their chances for future success. The full-day services also give participant's parents, who would otherwise be unable to afford these services, the opportunity to seek employment, or return to school in hopes of creating better economic opportunities for their families.

RAP intends to apply for continued CSPP funding from CDE for FY 2024-25 to be utilized at any of RAP's current or pending licensed preschools. The CFA, in the form substantially attached hereto as Attachment 1, requires the Board of Recreation and Parks Commissioners (Board) to adopt a resolution, attached hereto as Attachment 2. CDE intends to distribute the terms and conditions of the FY 2024-25 CSPP grant no later than June 1, 2024, at which time RAP staff will return to the Board for acceptance of a grant award renewal, along with its terms and conditions. RAP has the option of rejecting the terms of the contract before July 1, 2024, otherwise the contract will be automatically renewed with no further action required.

FISCAL IMPACT

Submitting a CFA for the CSPP grant from CDE does not impact RAP's General Fund. If awarded and accepted, this grant would provide funding to continue the subsidized preschool programs at the Jim Gilliam Child Care Center and Ralph M. Parsons Preschool within EXPO Center, and any of the four new and six pending licensed preschools.

Overview

Contractors holding a current California State Preschool Program (CSPP) contract, and if applicable a Prekindergarten and Family Literacy Support (CPKS) contract, who wish to be considered for continued funding for fiscal year (FY) 2023–24 must complete this application for continued funding. The FY 2023–24 Continued Funding Application (CFA) Overview and Instructions may be accessed on the <u>CFA web page</u>.

Upon completion of this CFA, the California Department of Education (CDE) will review the application and may contact your agency seeking additional information. CSPP contractors who apply for and are approved for continued funding do not need to sign a contract with the CDE to provide CSPP and CPKS services for FY 2023–24, as contracts will be automatically renewed in accordance with all applicable federal and state laws as well as all CSPP Contract Terms and Conditions (CT&Cs) that will be incorporated into the 2023–24 CSPP contract, and all CPKS CT&Cs, as applicable. By signing this CFA, the CSPP contractor is indicating that it wishes to automatically renew its contract for FY 2023–24 and is willing to, and does accept, all of the terms and conditions of the 2023–24 CSPP contract and, if applicable the 2023–24 CPKS contract, which will be provided to the CSPP contractor no later than June 1, 2023.

Please also note that contractors have no vested right to a subsequent contract. Completion of this CFA does not guarantee a renewal of funding. If the CDE determines your agency will not be renewed for a subsequent contract year, you will be notified in writing no later than April 7, 2023, pursuant to the *California Code of Regulations*, Title 5 (5 *CCR*) Section 17828. Contractors who apply for and are approved for continued funding do not need to sign a contract with the CDE to provide CSPP and, if applicable, CPKS services for FY 2023–24, as contracts will be automatically renewed in accordance with all applicable federal and state laws as well as all CSPP and CPKS CT&Cs that will be incorporated into the 2023–24 contract, as applicable.

If the CFA is returned to the CDE in a timely manner but is not fully and accurately completed, funding for FY 2023–24, if approved, may be delayed.

Contractors that wish to reject the terms of the FY 2023–24 CSPP and/or CPKS contract must provide the CDE with a written notice that the terms of the contract(s) are rejected by emailing ChildDevelopmentContracts@cde.ca.gov on or before June 30, 2023. The email should come from the Executive Director/Superintendent of the contracting entity or their authorized representative and state that the terms of the FY 2023–24 CSPP and, as applicable, the CPKS contract are rejected. Contractors providing such notice to the CDE of the rejection of the terms of the contract will not have a contract(s) in effect for FY 2023–24. Note that while contractors who currently receive CPKS funding may reject their 2023–24 CPKS contract, they cannot reject their 2023–24 CSPP contract and still receive funding under a CPKS contract since CPKS funding is tied to having a CSPP contract.

If a contractor wishes to terminate the contract for any reason during the FY 2023–24 contract term, the contractor shall notify the CDE of its intent to terminate the contract at least 90 calendar days in advance of contract termination and shall follow *CCR* 17795.
