SUMMARY

RAP anticipates additional appropriations are needed for the following accounts in the following amounts: Overtime, General (\$1,500,000.00) and SNL-Vendor Only (\$150,000.00).

A transfer to Overtime, General account is needed to pay overtime cost incurred by RAP to

support seasonal programming (e.g. Swim LA, Summer Camp) and to react promptly to unforeseen events (e.g. extreme weather, arrival of asylum seekers). Due to lack of sufficient part time staff and unfilled full-time positions, there was a higher than usual need for overtime staffing.

A transfer to SNL-Vendor Only is needed to pay for services provided by specialized artists/instructors for the Summer Night Lights (SNL) program and related activities in fiscal year 2023-24. RAP has played a supportive role in the implementation of the SNL program as developed and overseen by the Office of the Mayor (Mayor). SNL provides enhanced programming for economically disadvantaged neighborhoods during the summer months. RAP has largely provided maintenance services, opened up its facilities for use by SNL, and performed other supportive tasks. In preparation for the SNL program during the summer of 2015, the Mayor requested that RAP assume the duties of "the Fiscal Agent" for SNL. This involved assisting in hiring and paying all the part-time staff to be used for SNL, purchasing of materials, and procuring the services of specialized artists/instructors to offer classes to patrons at SNL sites.

FISCAL IMPACT

The transfers between accounts within Fund 302 are for budgetary adjustments that have a net zero impact on RAP's General Fund.
