CALL TO ORDER

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Jimmy Kim, General Manager, began his update by reminding the public that all of our special events can be found at laparks.org. Mr. Kim shared a couple of highlights, this weekend is the Griffith Park train rides 75th year of operating in that location, and all train rides will be 75 cents until they're sold out

Mr. Kim mentioned the department will be participating this weekend at City Hall at the LA Congress Neighborhood affair. Where all the leaders in the neighborhood councils will be meeting to discuss different topics and have different speakers talking about how they could better our city and participate in city government.

Mr. Kim mentioned some of the various communications from constituents from our last meeting, staff continues to work on addressing issues related to those communications.

Matthew Rudnick, Executive Officer provided the board with an update related to the Reseda Ice Rink Operating and management contract, there was a question regarding the force majeure language that was built into the contract. Typically, in most city contracts for services, there's force majeure language that both the contractor and the city can fall back on in the event of a natural disaster. The force majeure language was not unique to the contract, and so we recommend we proceed with that item moving forward.
