ITEM NO. (1) Member Watts acted as Chair in the absence of President Gibson and welcomed those in attendance and asked the members to introduce themselves. The Chair reported on the participation of LAEAC members La Vergne, Perez and Rewald at this year's Martin

- ITEM NO. (3) Public Comment. There were several comments concerning the flower vendors in the vicinity of the Forest lawn Drive exit from Highway 134, including questions as to when corrective actions would be taken and by what agency.
- ITEM NO. (4) The Chair next invited Member Brown to present a video summarizing statements made to the committee at its November meeting concerning the dangers to riders presented by the flower vendors in the vicinity of the Forest lawn Drive exit from Highway 134 and Tunnels 7 and 8. The Chair next recognized Member Salaices who reported funding of about \$20,000 was available to install metal fencing to prevent flower vendors from jumping onto the bridle path at Tunnel 8. He described the fencing material and and the proposed fencing plan. This generated extensive comments from members and the public. In view of the many questions raised concerning the efficacy of the fence, a motion was duly made and seconded to table action on the proposal and to actively solicit additional public comment with the view of refining the proposal prior to the next LAEAC meeting in March.
