WHAT IS "WORC"?

WORC trains women to become baseball / softball umpires, certifying them to work as independent contractors at any of the Department of Recreation and Parks' over 120 Recreation Centers citywide. The Department of Recreation and Parks offers these trainings in an effort to bridge the gender equity gap in officiating, and to expand our pool of female officials.

WHEN IS THE TRAINING?

Program runs on the following dates and times (6 classes):
Feb. 6th, 13th, 15th, 20th, 27th & 29th (4 in-class, 2 on-field).
Thursdays (6th/13th/20th/27th): 6:00pm-9:00pm,
