RECOMMENDATION

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- Approve the scope of work and total budget for the South Park Recreation Center -1. Lighting and Security Cameras Installation (PRJ21674) Project (Project), as described in the Summary of this Report;
- Approve the proposed Project to be bid and constructed through the RAP's list of pre-2. qualified on-call contractors;
- 3. Approve the authorization of change orders as authorized under Report No. 06-136, for the construction contracts for this proposed Project in the budget contingency amounts for such contracts as stated in this Report;
- 4. Determine that the project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 3(4) [Installation of new equipment and/or industrial facilities required for safety, health, the public convenience, or environmental control involving negligible or no expansion of use] of City CEQA Guidelines and Article 19, Section 15303 of the California CEQA Guidelines and direct RAP Staff to file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk;

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- 5. Authorize RAP's Chief Accounting Employee to prepare a check to the Los Angeles County Clerk in the amount of \$75.00 for the purpose of filing a NOE; and,
- 6. Authorize RAP staff to make technical corrections as necessary to carry out the intent of this Report.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

South Park Recreation Center is located at 375 East 51st Street in the South Los Angeles area of the City. This 18.25-acre park features a gymnasium, swimming pool, basketball and tennis courts, a ball diamond and turf field, a synthetic turf field, an outdoor stage, outdoor fitness area, picnic tables, and children's play areas. Approximately 21,527 City residents live within a one-half mile walking distance of South Park Recreation Center. Due to the facilities, features, programs, and services it provides, South Park Recreation Center meets the standard for a Community Park, as defined in the City's Public Recreation Plan.

PROJECT SCOPE

The scope of the proposed Project includes the following:

• Installation of additional lighting and security cameras throughout the park.

PROJECT FUNDING

The proposed Project was awarded Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds from the 2022-23 Program Year 48 (CF No. 21-1186-S1).

The total amount of funding available for the proposed Project is Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00), which will be the total budget for this Project inclusive of the budget contingency amounts set forth below.

The anticipated pre-qualified on-call contracts will be for Security Cameras Systems. The budget contingency for the Security Cameras Systems contracts will be Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00).

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PROJECT CONSTRUCTION

RAP Staff has determined that sufficient funding has been identified and construction for the proposed Project is anticipated to begin in Spring 2023.

TREES AND SHADE

The proposed Project will have no impact to existing trees or shade at South Park Recreation Center.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The proposed Project consists of installation of new equipment required for safety involving negligible or no expansion of use.

According to the parcel profile report retrieved November 4, 2022, the site does not reside in a liquefaction zone and is not within a coastal, methane, or historic zone, so there is no reasonable possibility that the project may impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern or have a significant effect due to unusual circumstances. No other known projects would involve cumulatively significant impacts, and no future projects would result from the proposed Project. As of November 4, 2022, the State Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) (Envirostor at www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov) has not listed the Project site or any contaminated sites near the Project area (within 500 feet). According to the Caltrans Scenic Highway Map there is no scenic highway located within the vicinity of the project or within the project site. Furthermore, the project is not located in proximity of a known historical resources and will not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of any historical resource.

Based in this information, RAP Staff recommends that the Board of Recreation and Parks Commissioners (Board) determines that the proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 3(4) of City CEQA Guidelines and Article 19, Section 15303 of California CEQA Guidelines. RAP Staff will file a NOE with the Los Angeles County Clerk upon the Board's approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The estimated costs for the design, development, and construction of the proposed park improvements are anticipated to be funded by CDBG funds or funding sources other than RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the proposed park improvements can be performed by current staff with minimal impact to existing maintenance service at this facility.
