RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. Accept the work performed under Contract No. 3597 for the Sepulveda Recreation Center Outdoor Improvements Phase III (PRJ21004) (W.O. #E170122F) Project (Project) by Chris Kelly Inc. Childs Play (Childs Play), a Department of Recreation and Parks' (RAP) pre-qualified on-call contractor, as outlined in the Summary of this Report;
- Authorize the RAP Chief Accounting Employee or Designee to release all retention monies held under Contract No. 3597 to Childs Play, within 35 calendar days after acceptance of Childs Play's work for the Project by the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board);
- 3. Authorize the Board Secretary to furnish Childs Play with a letter of completion; and,
- 4. Approve the Change Order Log for this Project as set forth in the Attachment No. 2 of this Report.

SUMMARY

The Project is located at 8801 Kester Avenues, Panorama City, CA 91405, within Council District 6. This facility includes two indoor gymnasiums, a community room, seasonal swimming pool, indoor and outdoor basketball courts, and children's play area. Recreational programs facilitated at the site include basketball, boxing, karate, after school care, summer camp and tutoring.

The Project scope entailed the installation of two bleachers, new drinking fountains, concreted pads, walkways and a new dugout with a shade structure on Field One and Two.

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The Board approved the final plans for the Project on November 6, 2019 (Report No. 19-226, Attachment No. 1), and bids for the work were solicited from RAP's pre-qualified contractors. Three (3) bids were received on February 20, 2020. Childs Play's bid of \$504,189, was determined to be the lowest responsive and responsible bid, and a Notice to Proceed letter was issued to Childs Play on June 5, 2019.

Plans and specifications for the Project were prepared by Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering (BOE) Architectural Division. The BOE Construction Division completed the construction management of the Project.

BOE has informed RAP that the Project is complete, and Childs Play has furnished the required permits, drawings, operation and maintenance manuals, warranties and guarantees, and Certificates of Occupancy. RAP took ownership of the Project improvements on January 20, 2021. The breakdown of the total construction cost is as follows:

During the course of construction, one (1) change order was issued with a total amount of \$5,559.00 or 1.1% of the base contract amount, which increased the total construction contract to an amount not to exceed \$509,748.00. The single change order issued for an amount of \$5,559.00, addressed the need for an additional 350 sq. ft. of concrete, and was the result of an error in the Bid documents. The Actual Construction Cost is \$509,238.25, a net of 0.01% discount of \$509,748.00.

The construction of the Project was fully funded by Proposition K and Quimby funds. The details of the funding sources utilized for this Project were outlined in Board Report No. 19-226.

BOE staff consulted with the Office of Contract Compliance (OCC) of the Department of Public Works, Bureau of Contract Administration, concerning the status of the labor compliance requirements on the Project. OCC reported that Childs Play is in compliance with the labor requirements for the Project.

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TREES AND SHADE

This Project (Phase III) does not require any tree removal. Existing trees near the location of proposed improvements were protected during the construction period. New dugout shade covers were constructed as part of the Project.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

The proposed Board's action consists of the acceptance of a project whose environmental impacts have been assessed on June 2, 2010 (BR 10-154) and on November 6, 2019 (BR 19-226). Staff found that the proposed action does not cause a direct or reasonably indirect physical change in the environment which has not been previously evaluated, therefore, it does not constitute a "project" pursuant to Section 21065 of the California Public Resources Code and is not subject to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). No further CEQA determination is required.

FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT:

There is no immediate fiscal impact to RAP's General Fund as a result of this Project. Construction of the proposed Phase III was fully funded by Proposition K and Quimby funds. Maintenance funds for the park will be requested as part of the annual City budget process.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Approve the final plans and specifications, substantially in the form as attached to this Report, for the proposed Sepulveda Recreation Center Outdoor Improvements (W.O. #E170122F) Project - Phase III (Phase III);
- Determine that the proposed Phase III is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 11(3), of the City CEQA Guidelines and Article 19, Section 15311 of California CEQA Guidelines, and;
- 3. Authorize the Department of Recreation and Park's (RAP) Chief Accounting Employee or designee to make technical corrections as necessary to carry out the intent of this Report.

SUMMARY

The Sepulveda Recreation Center Outdoor Improvements Project (Project) is located 8801 Kester Avenue, Panorama City, CA 91405, within Council District 7. The Project scope for the Proposition K – L.A. for Kids Program (Prop K) Specified Grant is, "Outdoor Refurbishment, Improvements to Athletic Fields and Swimming Pool." The Project has been phased based on funding availability, community input and RAP priorities.

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Phase I – Completed

The scope of work for Phase I was comprised of the improvement to the existing swimming pool which was furnished with an Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant lift. The work was completed on June 30, 2011.

Phase II – Completed

The scope of work for Phase II was comprised of the refurbishment of outdoor athletic fields which included the installation of a smart irrigation system, and refurbishment of the athletic fields. The construction was completed by RAP's construction staff on May 2, 2018.

Phase III

Phase III is the current and final phase of the Project. The proposed Phase III includes the installation of new bleachers, walkways, and drinking fountains as set forth in the attachment to this Report.

The Department of Public Works, Bureau of Engineering (BOE) Architectural Division prepared the plans and specifications.

As required by the Proposition K - L.A. For Kids Program, the proposed Project was presented to the community. Three (3) Local Volunteer Neighborhood Oversight Committee (LVNOC) meetings were conducted on March 15, 2012, April 11, 2012, and July 25, 2012, respectively. Approximately ten (10) community members, including the four (4) LVNOC members attended each of the three (3) LVNOC meetings. The community, LVNOC, and the Office of Council District 7 (CD 7) are in full support of the Project.

After review by RAP and BOE staff, it was determined that the work can be performed by RAP pre-qualified on call contractors. RAP staff recommends the proposed Project be constructed by the on-call contractors and recommends BOE provide construction management services during the construction of these improvements. The City Engineer's estimate for the construction of the proposed Project is Four Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$420,000).

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TREES AND SHADE

The proposed Phase III does not require any tree removal. Existing trees near the location of proposed improvements will be protected during the construction period.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

Phase I and Phase II of the Sepulveda Recreation Center Outdoor Improvements have been previously evaluated for environmental impacts in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Guidelines, and a Notice of Exemption (NOE) was filed with the Los Angeles City Clerk on June 3, 2010, and the Los Angeles County Clerk on June 10, 2010. The proposed Phase III scope is a separate project, with a different scope of work which consists of the installation of accessory structures. As such, RAP staff recommends that the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board) determines that it is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article III, Section 1, Class 11(3), of City CEQA Guidelines and Article 19, Section 15311 of California CEQA Guidelines. A NOE will be filed with the Los Angeles County Clerk upon Board's approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

Construction of the proposed Phase III is fully funded by Proposition K and Quimby funds. There is no immediate fiscal impact on RAP's General Fund.




