GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Jimmy Kim, General Manager, began his update by introducing Chinyere Stoneham, Acting Assistant General Manager of the Recreation Division. to introduce staff and provide a little background of our Valley Region and Van Nuys Sherman Oaks Recreation Center. Mr. Kim also introduced Tracie Goldberg to give an update on the reopening of the VNSO pool.

Mr. Kim provided a brief update that our RAP Staff and the Place Works consultant team hosted and open house last night at the Friendship Auditorium regarding the reimagining o the Griffith Park Concession. Mr. Kim stated there were approximately 120 community members who provided valuable input on the topic. The Placework team will be providing a summary of the open house online and at a future meeting.

Mr. Kim introduced Veronica Pollanco, Chief Innovation Officer who presented staff with the two awards we received. RAP received the California Park and Recreation Society 2023 Marketing and Communications award of excellence. Our RAP Aquatic division received an award for best of aquatics for their program, to learn to serve and learn to kayak adaptive versions for people with disabilities. Mr. Kim went on to thank all of Recreation and Parks staff for their hard work and dedication to the department and community.

Vice President Sanchez thanked the staff at VNSO Recreation Center and the constituents that are here today. He stated as someone who has a child on the spectrum, I really appreciate this parks efforts and RAP's efforts to really focus on equity, not only for students of color and students who are from low-income communities. But in particular, young people who are facing other challenges.
