Thursday, November 6, 2025

The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners of the City of Los Angeles convened the Regular Meeting at 9:02 a.m. Present were, Vice President Luis Sanchez, Commissioner Tafarai Bayne, Commissioner Marie Lloyd and Commissioner Benny Tran. CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Vice President Sanchez called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 16, 2025. Commissioner Lloyd made such motion, and it was seconded by Commissioner Tran. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 3-0.

Commissioner Bayne joined the meeting at 9:10 a.m.

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Jimmy Kim, General Manager began his update by introducing Sonya Young Jimenez the Superintendent of the West Region Recreation division to provide and introduction of the staff and share a bit of history regarding Mar Vista Recreation Center.

Mr. Kim stated the Commission has received various communications from constituents, and he has assigned appropriate staff for follow up. Mr. Kim stated that specific items requested by the Board, for the Elysian Park Master Plan requested by Vice President Sanchez. Related to the community involvement, I wanted to report back that the Elysian Park Master Plan has not yet been awarded, but public engagement is part of the project scope, and that will start once the project is awarded to the appropriate bidder. For Lemon Grove, this again requested by Vice President Sanchez, RAP staff is coordinating with the Senior Lead Officer to increase enforcement around gang and public drinking issues. We have also requested maintenance staff to provide additional

support for graffiti abatement and homeless encampment removal, so that those issues are addressed as they come up. Mr. Kim also mentioned that the facility does have a successful co-rec futsal program, but we are also aware of the demand for converting existing green space into a permanent futsal court. We're currently in discussions with the community and the council office. Additionally, as requested by Commissioner Lloyd for the Hazard Park Exterior, restroom. The restroom is part of the overall scope to make park-wide improvements at Hazard Park. The project is currently in the design phase with our consultant. We are at about 15% complete with design, and we anticipate completing the construction documents and going out to bid for construction by spring of 2026.

Mr. Kim introduced Megan Luera Sr. Management Analyst II from the Planning, Maintenance and Construction Branch to provide an update on Fiscal Year 2025 Park Fee Annual Report.

Mr. Kim introduced Patrick Siggins, Director of Homelessness Services from the Office of Nithya Raman, Council District 4. To provide an update on the ongoing services of the ABH Riverside Ambassador Program.

Mr. Kim thanked the staff at Mar Vista Recreation center for their assistance during the Palisades fire.

Commission Task Force on Concessions

Commissioner Tran provided an update on the Rancho Park Clubhouse project that is moving along in terms of the rebuild from the department side. And then also, in parallel, there is an RFP out there for the Food and Beverage portion. The proposal date for the F&B concessions were extended to October 28th at that time, and then further extended to November 13th to give more opportunity for people to, be part of that process so that we can end up with a great concessionaire. He also provided an update Griffith Park Food and Beverage Concession. Lastly, he mentioned they discussed the public Wi-Fi system and soliciting, companies to support the installation of Wi-Fi systems out of facilities that are needed for the public, and also some for critical staff as well.

Commission Task Force on Facility Repair and Maintenance

This Task force did not meet.

COMMISSION BUSINESS

Comments from the Commissioners on Matters within the Board's jurisdiction and Requests by Commissioners to Schedule Specific Future Agenda Items were requested. Commissioner Lloyd requested a report back on the play structure at Obama Recreation Center, she want to make sure, that when the project comes to the board for consideration that constituents' safety concerns have been addressed. Commissioner Lloyd would also like to request updates on both the Pacific Palisades project and any Olympics projects, before the end of the year. Commissioner Bayne requested a report back on artificial turf and more clarity on the process.
