FREMONT HIGH SCHOOL POOL - RETROFIT OF POOL BUILDING ROOF AND VENTILATION SYSTEM (PRJ21686) PROJECT - MODIFICATION OF SCOPE OF WORK - COMMITMENT OF SUPPLEMENTAL PARK FEES CATEGORICALLY EXEMPT FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA) PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 19, SECTIONS 15301(a) [INTERIOR OR EXTERIOR ALTERATIONS INVOLVING SUCH THINGS AS INTERIOR PARTITIONS, PLUMBING, AND ELECTRICAL 15301(c) [EXISTING HIGHWAYS AND CONVEYANCESI. SIDEWALKS, GUTTERS, BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN TRAILS, AND SIMILAR 15301(d) **[RESTORATION REHABILITATION** OF FACILITIES], OR STRUCTURES. OR DAMAGED DETERIORATED FACILITIES. RECOMMENDATIONS

- Approve the modification of scope of work and the total budget of the Fremont High School Pool – Retrofit of Pool Building Roof and Ventilation System (PRJ21686) Project (Project), as described in the Summary of this Report;
- 2. Authorize Department of Recreation and Parks (RAP) staff to commit from the following fund and work order numbers listed below, a maximum of \$400,000.00 in Park Fees to the Project;

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- 3. Determine that the Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Sections 15301(a) [Interior or exterior alterations involving such things as interior partitions, plumbing, and electrical conveyances], 15301(c) [Existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities], 15301(d) [Restoration or rehabilitation of deteriorated or damaged structures, facilities, or mechanical equipment to meet current standards of public health and safety], and 15302 [Replacement or reconstruction of existing structures and facilities where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and have substantially the same purpose and capacity] of California CEQA Guidelines as well as Article III, Section 1, Class 1(1), Class 1(3) Class 1(4), Class 2 and Class 2(6) of City CEQA Guidelines, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (NOE) with the Los Angeles County Clerk and the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation:
- 4. Authorize RAP's Chief Accounting Employee to prepare a check to the Los Angeles County Clerk in the amount of \$75.00 for the purposes of filing an NOE; and,
- 5. Authorize RAP staff to make technical corrections as necessary to carry out the intent of this Report.

SUMMARY

Fremont High School Pool is located at 7630 South Towne Avenue in the South Los Angeles community of the City. This 0.64-acre facility provides an indoor, year-round swimming pool for the use of the surrounding community. Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) owns the facility. Due to the size of the park, and the facilities, features, and programs it provides, Fremont High School Pool currently meets the standard for a Community Park, as defined in the City's Public Recreation Plan.

On December 15, 2022 the Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners (Board) approved the scope of work for the Fremont High School Pool – Retrofit of Pool Building Roof and Ventilation System Project (Report No. 22-307).

PROJECT SCOPE

The scope of work previously approved by the Board includes the following:

- Complete structural replacement of the pool building roof system
- Replacement and upgrading of the existing HVAC system
- Replacement of the skylights to include louver system
- Lighting improvements at the pool building with energy efficient fixtures

During the plan check process, the Los Angeles Department of Building and Safety (LADBS) determined that one of the two existing restrooms serving the pool area was required to be brought to compliance with current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards. Additionally, the path of travel from the public right-of-way leading to the front entrance of the facility needs to be brought to compliance with current ADA standards. RAP staff has determined that additional funding is required in order to implement the ADA upgrades.

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PROJECT FUNDING

Previously, the Board approved the commitment of \$3,507,790.05 in Park Fees to the Project (Report No. 22-307). Upon approval of this Report, an additional \$400,000.00 in Park Fees can be committed to the Project. The total amount of funding available for the Project including the supplemental Park Fees is \$3,907,790.05, which is the total budget of the Project inclusive of the budget contingency amount set forth below.

These Park Fees were collected within five miles of Fremont High School Pool, which is the standard distance for the commitment of Park Fees for community recreational facilities pursuant to Los Angeles Municipal Code Section 12.33 E.3. See below the anticipated pre-qualified on-call contract(s) and budget contingency amount(s) that will be used for the Project:

TREES AND SHADE

The Project has no impact on the existing shade and trees at Fremont High School Pool.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

The proposed Project adds new features and improvements to the retrofit of pool building roof and ventilation system project approved by the Board on December 15, 2022 (BR 22-307) and requires a new determination pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

The proposed Project consists of improvements to existing pedestrian trails where there will be negligible or no expansion of use, alterations involving remodeling or minor construction where there be negligible or no expansion of use, rehabilitation of deteriorated structures to meet current

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standards of public health and safety, internal lighting for security and operations, replacement or reconstruction of existing structures where the new structure will be located on the same site as the structure replaced and have substantially the same purpose and capacity, and replacement of existing heating and air-conditioning systems.

According to the parcel profile report retrieved on October 8, 2025, this area resides in a liquefaction zone. The construction of this Project will not create conditions that could lead to liquefaction. This site is not within a coastal, methane, or historic zone, so there is no reasonable possibility that the Project may impact on an environmental resource of hazardous or critical concern or have a significant effect due to unusual circumstances. No other known projects would involve cumulatively significant impacts, and no future projects would result from the proposed Project. As of October 8, 2025, the State Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) (Envirostor at www.envirostor.dtsc.ca.gov) has listed the Project site as RB Case #60001888. The site has been investigated multiple times and the soil results contaminated with organochlorine pesticides, lead based paint, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons and dioxins. The proposed Project site is outside the contaminated area. According to the Caltrans Scenic Highway Map, there is no scenic highway located within or adjacent to the Project site. Furthermore, the Project is not located in proximity of a known historical resources and will not cause a substantial adverse change in the significance of a historical resource.

Based on this information, staff recommends that the Board determine that the proposed Project is categorically exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Article 19, Sections 15301(a), 15301(c), 15301(d) and 15302 of California CEQA Guidelines and Article III Section 1, Class 1(1), Class 1(3), Class 1(4), Class 2 and Class 2(6) of City CEQA Guidelines. Staff will file a Notice of Exemption with the Los Angeles County Clerk and the Governor's Office of Land Use and Climate Innovation upon Board's approval.

FISCAL IMPACT

The approval of this commitment of Park Fees will have no fiscal impact on RAP's General Fund. The estimated costs for the design, development, and construction of the proposed park improvements are anticipated to be funded by Park Fees or funding sources other than RAP's General Fund. The maintenance of the proposed park improvements can be performed by current staff with minimal impact to existing maintenance service at this facility.
