REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

BOARD OF RECREATION AND PARKS COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES

Thursday, October 16, 2025

The Board of Recreation and Park Commissioners of the City of Los Angeles convened the Regular Meeting at 9:00 a.m. Present were, Vice President Luis Sanchez, Commissioner Tafarai Bayne, Commissioner Marie Lloyd and Commissioner Benny Tran. CALL TO ORDER

APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES

Vice President Sanchez called for a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of October 2, 2025. Commissioner Bayne made such motion, and it was seconded by Commissioner Lloyd. There being no objections, the motion was unanimously approved by a vote of 3-0. Commissioner Bayne voted to Abstain from this vote due to being absent at the Meeting held on October 2nd.

GENERAL MANAGER'S UPDATE

Jimmy Kim, General Manager began his update by introducing Anita Meacham the Superintendent of the Metro Region Recreation division to provide and introduction of the staff and share a bit of history regarding Chevy Chase Recreation Center.

Mr. Kim stated the Commission has received various communications from constituents, and he has assigned appropriate staff for follow up. Mr. Kim made note that today October 16th at 10:16 a.m. will be participating the International Shakeout day. This is when millions across the region will simultaneously drop, cover, and hold on. The drill scenario is a simulated 7.8 magnitude earthquake striking on the San Andreas Fault, developed by seismologists and experts. By participating, we not only enhance our readiness, but also recognize that practicing emergency preparedness is the most effective strategy for building a stronger, safer, and more resilient Los Angeles.

Mr. Kim mentioned that Mr. Patrick Higgins CD4's Director of Homeless Services is in attendance today. He was ready to report out on the ABH Riverside status update. But RAP didn't agendize it on this meeting's agenda, so we will agendize it for the next meeting, where he will come and give a full report out.

Mr. Kim provided a few report backs that was requested by the Commissioners. Mr. Kim stated RAP. Real Estate and Maintenance teams will be meeting with the Legacy LA Armory next week. To look at the lease and go over their proposal for consideration. He also provided a report back on synthetic turf. The Department of Recreation and Parks began installing synthetic sports fields in the early 2000s to address both high demand for public play space, as well as citywide water conservancy goals. From that effort, we have seen significant savings with the estimated annual savings of 103 million gallons, resulting in a notable decrease in our water utility costs, which the department has to pay. We also have made considerable cost savings in maintenance. For context, it takes about 2 staff to maintain 75 synthetic fields, whereas you would need, triple and quadruple that amount to maintain natural grass fields. We have also increased community access and facility scheduling due to the continuous year-round use without requiring extensive downtime for recovery and repair. Player safety is a priority for us, with maintenance focused on ensuring an even, level surface, a condition often difficult to achieve on heavily used natural grass fields. This has resulted in claims and litigation for RAP. We have also placed shock-absorbing pads beneath the turf to further mitigate impact-related injuries.

Mr. Kim introduced Sonia Young Jimenez the Superintendent of the West Region to recognize Dylan Thomas for his heroic efforts in saving a life.
